# About our school



St James' C of E Infant and Nursery school is situated on the West Cumbrian coast in Whitehaven. It was established in 1875, but most of the current building dates from 1967. As a voluntary controlled school it maintains close links with the Parish Church and values its Christian ethos, but it is open to children of all denominations.

The school serves the neighbourhood, extending between Wellington Row, Strand Street, Lowther Street, Midgley, Harras Moor, Red Lonning, the area south of Aikbank, Bay Vista, Loop Road North and Solway View. Children from the areas mentioned will have first priority for places. Full details are available in the Local Authority's "General Information for Parents" booklet.

There are six main teaching areas with a central hall and an entrance at each end.

Scafell and Skiddaw are at the lower end of the school building and Great Gable, Melbreak and Catbells are at the front end of the building.

Currently Great Gable, Melbreak and Catbells are our Early Years classrooms. Scafell and Skiddaw accommodate our Year 1 and 2 children.

Teachers meet weekly to plan the curriculum for each year group. This ensures that children in each year group follow the same curriculum even though they are in different classes.

The topics are planned in two-yearly cycles, one for each half term. Curriculum information booklets are prepared and issued at the beginning of each term. They are also available on our website under curriculum.

## Wrap Around Care

We offer a Breakfast Club and an After School Club which are available to all pupils. The Breakfast Club runs from 7.40am and the After School Club is available up to 5.15pm. Current charges are detailed on our website.

# Our Curriculum

## Early Years



### Teaching and Learning

#### Foundation Stage

The Nursery year is part of the Early Years Foundation Stage for children from birth to five years old. Teachers plan activities and experiences that are carefully matched to the children's needs and stages of development.

Learning in the Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum takes place around the following seven areas:

Communication and language

Physical development

Personal, social and emotional development

Literacy

Mathematics

Understanding the world

Expressive arts and design

Play, both indoors and out, is an essential part of development and learning. Children learn best by doing things they really enjoy, so our skilled staff plan learning activities that are play-based, active and fun. Staff are skilled in providing the right balance of challenge and support to take the children forward whilst maintaining their confidence.

The children are encouraged to take responsibility from an early stage. Children from all year groups join our School Council and are involved in decision making.

We have excellent transition arrangements in place to support the children as they move up through the school.

We accept Nursery children from the day after their 3rd birthday, most parents are entitled to 15 free hours and many working parents are entitled to 30 free hours. Parents can also pay to top up their entitlement.

Our wrap around care is available to every child including those in Nursery.



# Our Curriculum

## Year 1 and Year 2



### Teaching and Learning

#### Key Stage One

At St James' C of E Infant and Nursery we know that confidence is a key to success and we work hard to boost our children in this area. Children are better able to fulfil their potential when their emotional health and well-being are promoted and these aspects are very important.

#### Teaching Methods

In Years 1 and 2 we teach according to the National Curriculum for Key Stage 1. To find out more about what areas are covered and how we assess the children please click on the Curriculum tab under Key Information on our website.

Here at St James' C of E Infant and Nursery we use a variety of methods and schemes to teach children and help them progress. We use Read Write Inc to teach our children how to read and write. Read Write Inc. is a whole school programme with children being grouped across the school and all taught English at the same time each day. # Induction and Transition



## Induction

Once you receive your offer of a place at St James' Infant and Nursery you will receive an invitation to a Stay and Play session in the summer term to find out more about our induction into school. You will meet the Headteacher and your child's new teacher and will be able to ask questions you may have. You will also be given a welcome booklet that will give you more information about our school.

Later in the summer term there will be opportunity for you and your child to spend some time in their new classroom to meet the teachers and make some new friends.

Before your child starts school in September or when they start Nursery, the class teacher will make an appointment to visit you and your child at home. This is an informal meeting when you can get to know the members of staff in whose care your child will be and talk to them in privacy about anything relating to starting school.

At the meeting, we will share starting information and discuss with yourselves how we manage this. For children starting with us in Nursery, this may be a phased or part time approach to their hours. For new to Reception children, they will be visited at home and then will join us straight away. If you have any concerns about this, please discuss at our home visit.

If you have any concerns or worries please speak to us. We will listen!

## Transition

We take children from a wide variety of pre-school providers and we contact all of them to start to get to know your child before they start with us. We arrange home visits so that your child can meet their teacher in the comfort of their own home.

We have excellent transition arrangements in place to ensure the children move through the school happily.

After Year 2 all of our children move to St James' Junior School. We have really thorough transition arrangements in place with visits to and from the Junior School making transition seamless for our children. We often welcome junior children back to see us, to help with events or work with our children.



# Special Educational Needs



On average, about 20% of children need special help at some time with their schooling. Needs are identified in several ways: information is gathered from parents, pre-school groups, outside agencies, teacher observations or assessments. Children with needs identified will be supported appropriately. An Individual Education Plan (IEP) may be drawn up. Support will be given in the classroom, but small groups may be withdrawn when appropriate. Advice from outside agencies may be sought and Team Around the Child Meetings may be arranged.

For those children who need a little extra help from time to time, we offer a variety of interventions such as Read Write Inc Fast Track Phonics, Pre Teach maths and Nurture support. Each of these are tailored to the needs of the individual child. These are all aimed at giving a little extra help in addition to the quality teaching we offer. Our Senior Teaching Assistants are highly trained in these schemes, we find that children find the extra sessions enjoyable and confidence building.

The value of parental support and its effect on the learning and development of children is recognised and valued and we involve parents at all stages.

If you have any concerns about your child please speak to us—we are approachable and will take your concerns seriously.

# School Organisation



## Our School Day

The school doors are opened at 8.40am each morning. Teaching begins at 8.45am, allowing 5 minutes for the children to get settled.

Please note that children are NOT supervised on the playground by school staff before school starts.

1.00pm to 3.15pm

### Early Years

#### **Morning session**

8.45am to 11.45am

#### **Afternoon session**

1.00pm to 3.15pm

(Nursery 12.15pm-3.15pm)

At home time the teacher will bring the children to the doors for each class. Your child will be asked to remain in the classroom if you are delayed for any reason.

Various clubs are held in school throughout the year. These will be advertised on our weekly newsletter.



# Uniform

# Attendance



It is vital that your child attends school regularly, unless they are ill. Please telephone us on the first day of absence. We politely request that you don't book holidays in term time as your child may miss vital aspects of his or her education. Holidays in term-time will be classified as unauthorised absences and are only authorised in the most exceptional circumstances. An unauthorised absence will stay on your child's school record throughout their school life. Our school attendance target is 96.5%.
